The MISSION of the Toledo Symphony League is to provide financial, educational and volunteer support to the Toledo Symphony Orchestra so that it may provide quality musical performances for the entire community.

Criticism is found in just about every aspect of human existence. Whether it's fashion, sports, art forms, automobile design and function, education, literature - and even food, everything is open to criticism. We not only state what we think and like, but seek testimony from experts in every field to support our opinions. So we are critics in some way or another. Last month, we explored the beginning of musical criticism in journalism. Cultural shifts have moved criticism from a 'spectator sport' to a participatory activity. Anyone with a Facebook account can immerse themselves in comments about anything even before reviews or expert opinions are available.

A recent article has suggested that technical knowledge of musical art-form has disappeared from most in-depth discussions of music, and turned into 'lifestyle reporting. ECheck out leading music periodicals to discover what chart-topping musicians are wearing (or not), updates on their love lives, insights into food preferences, and travel routines. *Perhaps editors have forbidden the discussion of music in articles about musicians.* It seems as though they want scandal and spectacle.

The disappearance of critical judgment can be seen across every spectrum of modern media. Reviews are both downsized as well as dismissive of specialized expertise. Over time, cultural shifts have had an impact on every aspect of modern society. Music is treated as simply one more lifestyle accessory, no different from a stylish smart phone or a pair of running shoes. Hard-nosed criticism is squeezed out by soft stories, gossip, and 'fluff.'

The viewpoint expressed in this article may raise questions specifically geared to the pop musical scene rather than to classical, jazz, country western, or rock venues. However, it suggests that the focus of musical criticism has diminished to individual opinion, with little understanding of musical standards. Are there standards, or is all music criticism merely 'person judgment?' Do today's audiences care about performance or composer interpretation? Does any person read a critic's evaluation? Because critics are limited to a prescribed number of words, reviews may be aimed at box office economics, when in reality the performance, regardless of the musical genre, may be mediocre. Artists deserve a milieu in which musical talent is celebrated and given acknowledgement in the media. Criticism is a small part of the ecology of the music industry, but an essential part. Valid criticism is necessary to the growth of our musical understanding and artist appreciation.

Sunday, November 15 at 3:00 pm, 45 members of the Toledo Symphony Youth Orchestras will perform with the Ohio Music Education Association District I Regional Orchestra at Perrysburg High School. TSYO members make up 55% of the Regional Orchestra's total membership, and two thirds of the string section. The students from throughout OMEA District I were chosen by audition and will rehearse in the days preceding the concert; one weekday evening, all day Saturday and briefly just prior to their Sunday performance.

Dr. Stephen L. Gage, Professor of Music and Director of Bands at Youngstown State University Dana School of Music since 1993 will be the conductor, clinician. He holds degrees from the University of Illinois-Champaign, Eastman School of Music, and the State University of Nevada at Fredonia, and has studied conducting with many conductors, including David Effron. He has been Conductor of the Youngstown Symphony Youth Orchestra for 20 years, Principal Conductor with the Dana Symphony Orchestra in 2008 – 09 and Director of Bands at other universities and high schools. Dr. Gage has numerous published articles on conducting, rehearsal techniques and band literature and is an active guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator of international repute. He has affiliations with many professional organizations and holds several prestigious awards – including membership in American Bandmasters. He has received critical acclaim from many composers for his interpretations and recordings of their music. Dr. Gage resides in Poland, Ohio with his wife and two daughters, his son lives in Austin, Texas.

A very listenable program has been chosen for this year's Regional Orchestra. It will feature *MaVlast: mvt. III The Moldau* by Smetana, *Peer Gynt Suite: mvt. II ASE'S Death* by Grieg and *Symphony No. 2 in D: mvt. IV Finale* by Sibelius.




