Every so often, a subject for this column leads to many “forks in the road” – and the information from research becomes insurmountable for one article. This article, along with next month’s column, will examine arts criticism and the changes that are occurring there with astonishing speed. It used to be that every artist, producer or arts organization used to wait for reviews to determine the critical response for a particular project. There are still critics who wield great power to make or break a project, but it seems that most are immune to the opinions of any one journalist.

Fewer people are getting their news from print matter. Younger people get virtually all of their information online, through web sites, social media and chat rooms. Arts coverage has been slashed by many news outlets in an attempt to pare costs. There are fewer critics and less space devoted to serious art criticism. In the State of Texas, there is a grand total of zero full time classical music critics.

Musical journalism, as a general endeavor, has its roots in classical music criticism, which has traditionally embraced the study, discussion, evaluation and interpretation of music and its performance. Before the 1840’s, reporting was done either by musical journals or by a few reporters at a general newspaper. Modern art journalism is often informed by music theory, consideration of diverse elements of a musical piece or performance including its form, style, standards of technique and expression.

We are now seeing a shift in the arts dialogue. There are fewer informed critics, less technical information given, less space in our newspapers, and shrinking audiences that have little understanding (or wish to understand) as to how to discuss what composers are trying to communicate to us. Anyone can write a blog or leave a review in a chat room – but that does not mean they have expert judgment. Next month we will examine the dangers of amateur art criticism, the emergence of lifestyle reporting, and what happens if music dialogue is measured only by popularity.

TOLEDO SYMPHONY YOUTH ORCHESTRAS

The free opening concert for the Toledo Symphony Youth Orchestras 2015-16 season is slated for 4:00 pm, November 1 at the Toledo Museum of Art Peristyle.

“Overture” to *Royal Fireworks Music* by Handel will open the program. Written in celebration of the 1749 Peace of Aix-la-Chapelle treaty, the principle body of the fireworks was a disaster, but Handel’s music survived in spite of rain and some disagreements over the instruments to be used. The king wanted no “fiddles” so it is believed only wind and percussion performed in the huge ensemble: 9 trumpets, 9 horns, 24 oboes, 12 bassoons, 3 pairs of tympani, side drums and extra-large double drums that Handel rented from the Tower of London. The rehearsal at Vauxhall Gardens attracted 12,000 people and caused one of London’s first traffic jams! Filling out the Concert Orchestra portion of the concert, **Dr. Elaine Colprit** will lead the orchestra in *Cumberland Cross* by Carl Strommen and *Espana Cani* by Pascual Marquina Narro.

Symphonic Orchestra Conductor, **Patrick Barrett**, has chosen *Procession of the Nobles* by Rimsky-Korsakov, *Austrian Peasant Dance* by Mahler and the 4th movement of Symphony #5 (*Reformation*) by Mendelssohn for their segment of the concert. Mendelssohn used melodic themes from the Reformation hymn *A Mighty Fortress is Our God* in this work, hence the name *Reformation Symphony*.

The Philharmonic Orchestra, led by **Wasim Hawary**, will begin the closing section of the program with *Egmont Overture* by Beethoven; *Joyeuse March* by Chabrier will follow. Alexis Chabrier (1841-1894) was born in France and trained as a lawyer. He had several music theory and piano teachers at different times, but most of his musical training was self-taught. Today his most known work is *Rhapsody Espana*. The finale of the concert will be the colorful *Poet and Peasant Overture* by von Suppe.

Mark your calendar for 4:00 p.m., November 1. Attend the concert and be uplifted by the talent and enthusiasm of our gifted young orchestra members, ages 8 to 18!

On September 27, seven young musicians played for the Flower Hospital Auxiliary Fall Tea. These students attend area schools: Bedford, Maumee Valley Country Day School, Perrysburg, Summerfield, Sylvania and Toledo School for the Arts. All of the students study privately and play in their school orchestras.

This past year, The Remembrance Fund awarded \$11,010 to thirty-five musician scholarship winners. The Remembrance Fund welcomes any donation in memory of or in honor of a loved one.






